CI	<p><u>[N]DEFINITIONS</u></p> <p><u>ADD-ON-FARE</u>: See "Arbitrary"</p> <p><u>ADULT</u> - A person who has reached his/her 12th birthday as of the date of commencement of travel.</p> <p><u>AFRICA</u> - The area comprised of all the countries on the Continent of Africa other than Algeria, Morocco, Sudan, Tunisia, and Egypt, but including the following islands: Cape Verde, Comoros, Madagascar, Mauritius, Reunion, Sao Tome, Principe, and Seychelles.</p> <p><u>ANIMALS</u> - In addition to the usual connotation of domestic pets, reptiles, birds, poultry and fish.</p> <p><u>APPLICABLE FARE</u> - In fare construction, a fare that is established after the application of all fare construction calculations; e.g., excess mileage, higher intermediate fare, etc.</p> <p><u>ARBITRARY</u> - An amount published for use only in combination with other fares for the construction of through fares. It is also referred to as "Proportional fare", "Basing fare", and "Add-On-Fare".</p> <p><u>AREA NO. 1</u> (or "Area 1") - The area comprised of all of the North and South American continents and the islands adjacent thereto; Greenland, Bermuda, the West Indies, the islands of the Caribbean Sea, and the Hawaiian Islands (including Midway and Palmyra).</p> <p><u>AREA NO. 2</u> (or "Area 2") - The area comprised of all of Europe (including that part of the Russian Federation in Europe) and the islands adjacent thereto; Iceland, the Azores, all of Africa and the islands adjacent thereto; Ascension Island; that part of Asia lying west of and south west of and including Iran, Islamic Republic of.</p> <p><u>AREA NO. 3</u> (or "Area 3") - The area comprised of all of Asia and the islands adjacent thereto except that portion included in Area No. 2; all of the East Indies, South Asian Subcontinent, Australasia, the islands of the Pacific Ocean except those included in Area No. 1; Russian Federation (East of the Urals).</p> <p><u>ASIA</u> - The area comprised of Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Brunei, China, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, the islands of the Pacific in Area No. 3 north of the Equator, Japan, Kazakhstan, Kampuchea, Korea, Kyrgyzstan, Laos, Malaysia, Maldives Island, Myanmar, Nepal, Outer Mongolia, Pakistan, Philippines, Russian Federation (East of the Ural mountains), Singapore, Sri Lanka, Taiwan, Tajikistan, Timor, Thailand, Turkmenistan, Uzbekistan and Vietnam.</p> <p><u>ASSEMBLY POINT</u> - A point in the itinerary where the entire qualifying group assembles and commences transportation as a group.</p> <p><u>AUSTRALASIA</u> - The area comprised of Australia; New Caledonia; New Zealand; New Hebrides; Fiji; Samoa, Cook Islands, Papua New Guinea, Tahiti and the islands adjacent thereto.</p> <p><u>AUTHORIZED AGENT</u> - A passenger sales agent who has been appointed by carrier to represent carrier in the sale of air passenger transportation over the services of carrier and, when authorized, over the services of other air carriers.</p> <p><u>BAGGAGE</u>, which is equivalent to luggage, such articles, effects and other personal property of a ticketed passenger as are necessary or appropriate for the wear, use, comfort or convenience of the passenger in connection with the passenger's trip. Unless otherwise specified, it includes both checked and unchecked baggage of the passenger.</p> <p><u>BAGGAGE CHECK OR BAGGAGE CLAIM TAG</u> - Those portions of the ticket that provide for the carriage of a passenger's checked baggage and which are issued by the carrier as receipt for the passenger's checked baggage.</p> <p><u>BAGGAGE TAG</u> - A document issued by carrier solely for the identification of checked baggage, the baggage (strap) tag portion of which is attached by the carrier to a particular article of checked baggage and the baggage (claim) tag portion of which is given to the passenger.</p> <p><u>BANKERS BUYING RATE</u> ("BBR") - The rate at which, for the purpose of the transfer of funds through banking channels (i.e., other than transactions in bank notes, travelers cheques and similar banking instruments), a bank will purchase a given amount of foreign currency in exchange for one unit (or units) of the national currency of the country in which the exchange transaction takes place.</p> <p><u>BANKERS SELLING RATE</u> ("BSR") - The rate at which, for the purpose of the transfer of funds through banking channels (i.e., other than transactions in bank notes, travelers cheques and similar banking instruments), a bank will sell a given amount of foreign currency in exchange for one unit (or units) of the national currency of the country in which the exchange transaction takes place.</p> <p><u>BASING FARE</u>: See "Arbitrary"</p>

C1	<p>[N]DEFINITIONS (Continued)</p> <p><u>BUSINESS (INTERMEDIATE), ECONOMY AND FIRST CLASS FARES</u> - The full fares established for normal/regular or usual service, the application of which is not dependent upon any specifically limited period of ticket validity or other special circumstances and that are applicable for travel in the business, first and economy class cabins as is appropriate.</p> <p><u>CABIN BAGGAGE</u> - Baggage, which due to its size and nature requires the purchase of a seat on board the aircraft to transport the piece of baggage.</p> <p><u>CALENDAR MONTH</u> - The period of time starting with any day in a month, identified by number, and ending with the same day of the following month. When the same day does not occur in the following month, this period ends on the last day of that month.</p> <p><u>CALENDAR WEEK</u> - A period of seven days starting at 12:01 a.m. Sunday and ending at 12:00 p.m. of the following Saturday; provided that when a carrier offers only once a week service between two points, it shall mean a period of eight days commencing with 12:01 a.m. on the day the flight operates.</p> <p><u>CANCELLATION CHARGE/FREE</u> - The service charge made by reason of failure of a passenger to use reserved accommodation without having cancelled such accommodation prior to the latest appropriate time for cancellation specified by the carrier.</p> <p><u>CARIBBEAN AREA</u> - The area comprising Anguilla, Antigua, Aruba, Bahamas, Barbados, Barbuda, Bermuda, Bonaire, British Virgin Islands, Cayman Islands, Cuba, Curacao, Dominica, Dominican Republic, Grenada, Guadeloupe, Haiti, Jamaica, Leeward Islands, Martinique, Montserrat, Netherlands Antilles, Nevis, Saba, St. Barthelemy, St. Eustatius, St. Kitts, St. Lucia, St. Maarten, St. Vincent, Trinidad and Tobago, Turks and Caicos Islands, West Indies and Windward Islands.</p> <p><u>CARRIAGE</u> - Transportation of passengers and their baggage by air, either gratuitously or for hire.</p> <p><u>CARRIER</u> - The air carrier issuing the ticket and all air carriers that carry or undertake to carry the passenger and/or his baggage thereunder or perform or undertake to perform any other services related to such air carriage.</p> <p><u>CARRIER'S REGULATIONS</u> - Rules other than these conditions, published by carrier and in effect on date of ticket issue, governing carriage of passengers and/or baggage and shall include any applicable tariffs in force.</p> <p><u>CENTRAL AFRICA</u> - The area comprised of Malawi, Zambia and Zimbabwe.</p> <p><u>CENTRAL AMERICA</u> - The area comprised of Belize, Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua and Panama.</p> <p><u>CERTIFIED DEATH OR ILLNESS</u> - Substantiated by a death/medical certificate.</p> <p><u>CHANGE OF EQUIPMENT (GAUGE)</u> - A schedule change of aircraft, occurring at least once en route that is identified by one airline designator/flight number between the station of origin and destination points.</p> <p><u>CHARGE</u> - An amount to be paid for carriage of goods or excess baggage, based on the applicable rate for such carriage; or an amount to be paid for a special or incidental service in connection with the carriage of a passenger or baggage.</p> <p><u>CHARTER</u> - The hire of an aircraft.</p> <p><u>CHECKED BAGGAGE</u> (registered luggage)- Baggage of which carrier takes sole custody and for which the carrier has issued a baggage check and a baggage claim tag.</p> <p><u>CHILD</u> - A person who has reached his/her second birthday but not his/her 12th birthday as of the date of commencement of travel.</p> <p><u>CIRCLE TRIP - NORMAL FARES</u> - Travel from a point and return thereto by a continuous circuitous air route including travel comprising two fare components but which do not meet the conditions of the round trip definition provided that where no reasonable direct scheduled air route is available between the break points, a break in the circle between two fare construction points may be travelled by any other - of transportation without prejudice to the circle trip.</p> <p><u>CIRCLE TRIP - SPECIAL FARES</u> - Travel from a point and return thereto by a continuous circuitous air route comprising two fare components which do not meet the conditions of the round trip definition provided that where no reasonable direct scheduled air route is available between the break points, a break in the circle between two fare construction points may be travelled by any other - of transportation without prejudice to the circle trip.</p>

C1	<p>[N]DEFINITIONS (Continued)</p> <p><u>CIVIL AERONAUTICS BOARD</u> ("C.A.B.") - The United States Department of Transportation ("D.O.T").</p> <p><u>CO-TERMINAL</u> - Specified cities that may be considered the same point for determination of journey type.</p> <p><u>CODESHARE</u> - The practice of carrier placing its two-letter designation code "AH" on flights operated by carriers other than AH.</p> <p><u>COMBINATION OF CHARGES</u> - An amount that is obtained by combining two or more charges,</p> <p><u>COMBINATION OF FARES</u> - When two or more one-way, round trip or half round trip fares are used and shown separately in a fare calculation.</p> <p><u>CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT</u> - The terms and conditions shown on the passenger ticket, or in the case of electronic tickets, the passenger receipt, and on the baggage check.</p> <p><u>CONJUNCTION TICKET</u> - Two or more tickets concurrently issued to a passenger and which together constitute a single contract of carriage.</p> <p><u>CONNECTION</u> - That point from which a passenger is scheduled to depart on the day of arrival to the next ticketed point, on a scheduled service of the same or another carrier. If there is no scheduled service to the next ticketed point on the day of arrival, departure within 24 hours shall constitute a connection unless restricted by a particular fare rule.</p> <p><u>CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES</u> - Damages which are reasonable, out of pocket expenses and other provable damages incurred by passenger as the consequence of the loss, damage or delay in the delivery of such personal property.</p> <p><u>CONSTRUCTED FARES</u> - An unspecified through fare constructed by the use of add-on amounts, or two or more fares shown as a single amount in a fare calculation.</p> <p><u>CONTIGUOUS UNITED STATES OR CONTINENTAL UNITED STATES</u> - The District of Columbia and all states of the United States other than Alaska and Hawaii.</p> <p><u>CONTRACT OF CARRIAGE</u> - The terms and conditions in this document, as amended from time to time by the carrier.</p> <p><u>CONVENTION</u> means the convention for the unification of certain rules relating to international carriage by air, signed at Warsaw, October 12, 1929, or that convention as amended by the Hague Protocol, 1955, or the Montreal Convention whichever may be applicable to carriage hereunder.</p> <p><u>COUNTRY OF COMMENCEMENT OF TRANSPORTATION</u> - The country from which travel on the first international sector takes place.</p> <p><u>COUNTRY OF PAYMENT</u> - The country where the purchaser makes payment to the carrier or its agent. Payment by cheque, credit card or other banking instruments shall be deemed to have been made at the place where the carrier or its agent accepts such instrument.</p> <p><u>CURRENCY OF THE COUNTRY OF ORIGIN/PAYMENT</u> - The currency in which international fares from that country are denominated.</p> <p><u>DAMAGE</u> includes death, injury, delay, loss, partial loss or other damage of whatsoever nature arising out of or in connection with carriage or other services performed by carrier incidental thereto.</p> <p><u>DATE OF TRANSACTION</u> - The date of issuance of the ticket, MCO or PTA.</p> <p><u>DAYS</u> - Full calendar days, including Sundays and legal holidays; provided that for purposes of notification, the balance of the day upon which notice is dispatched shall not be counted; and for purposes of determining the duration of a validity period, the balance of the day upon which the ticket is issued or flight commenced shall not be counted.</p>

CI	<p>[N]DEFINITIONS (Continued)</p> <p><u>DEADLINE</u>: (1) <u>Reservations</u>: The minimum number of days/weeks/months before the day of departure by which reservations must be confirmed. (2) <u>Payment</u>: The minimum number of days/weeks/months before the day of departure by which full payment must be made. (3) <u>Ticketing</u>: The minimum number of days/weeks/months before the day of departure by which ticketing must be completed. <u>Note 1</u>: When "deadline" is used in paragraphs other than reservations, payment and ticketing, the term refers to the deadline for reservations, payment and ticketing. When different deadlines apply, the relevant deadline will be indicated, e.g., "before the ticketing deadline". <u>Note 2</u>: "Before Deadline" includes transactions made on the deadline date.</p> <p><u>DECLARED VALUE FOR CARRIAGE</u> - The value of goods or baggage declared to the carrier by the passenger for the purposes of determining charges or of establishing the limit of the carrier's liability for loss, damage or delay.</p> <p><u>DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION ("DOT")</u> - The United States Department of Transportation.</p> <p><u>DEPARTURE</u> - The day/time of the flight on which the passenger is ticketed to travel. (1) Before departure - the first flight of the pricing unit. (2) After departure - a subsequent flight of the pricing unit.</p> <p><u>DESTINATION</u> - The ultimate point of the passenger's journey as shown on the ticket.</p> <p><u>DIRECT ROUTE</u> - The shortest all year route operated by a carrier in both directions between ticketed points at which it exercises traffic rights.</p> <p><u>DIRECT FARE</u> - In fare construction, a fare between two points without the application of fare construction calculations.</p> <p><u>DOMESTIC CARRIAGE</u> - (except as otherwise specified) carriage in which, according to the contract of carriage, the place of departure, the place of destination or stopover, and the entire transportation are within the sovereign state.</p> <p><u>DOMESTIC FARE</u> - A fare applicable between points in the same country.</p> <p><u>DOMESTIC TRANSFER</u> - A change from the domestic service of one carrier to the domestic service of the same carrier (online transfer) or the domestic service of another carrier (interline transfer).</p> <p><u>DOUBLE OPEN JAW</u> - Travel that is essentially of a round trip nature except that the outward point of arrival and the inward point of departure and the outward point of departure and the inward point of arrival are not the same.</p> <p><u>DOWNGRADE</u> - A passenger's involuntary displacement from First Class to Business Class, First to Economy Class or Business Class to Economy Class when there are more passengers with confirmed reservations and tickets than there are available seats.</p> <p><u>EAST AFRICA</u> - The area comprising Burundi, Djibouti, Ethiopia, Kenya, Rwanda, Somalia, Tanzania, and Uganda.</p> <p><u>EASTBOUND</u> - Travel from a point in Area No. 1 to a point in Area No. 2 or 3 via the Atlantic Ocean or travel from a point in Area No. 2 or 3 to a point in Area no. 1 via the Pacific Ocean.</p> <p><u>EASTERN HEMISPHERE</u> - The area comprised of Africa, Asia/Area 3, Europe and the Middle East for travel via the Atlantic Ocean.</p> <p><u>EDUCATIONAL ESTABLISHMENT</u> - A school, academy, college, or university offering full time educational, vocational or technical courses for a school year and does not include a commercial office, industrial or military establishment or a hospital at which a student is serving an apprenticeship unless such apprenticeship is part of the school curriculum of the educational establishment at which the student is enrolled.</p> <p><u>END ON COMBINATION</u> is the combination of two or more fares that could be ticketed separately at a fare construction point (not applicable to combination of fares between the same points).</p> <p><u>ENDORSEMENT</u> the transfer of authority required when a passenger with an international ticket wishes to rebook to a carrier other than the carrier shown on the ticket.</p>
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C1	<p>[N]DEFINITIONS (Continued)</p> <p><u>ELECTRONIC COUPON</u> - an electronic flight coupon or other value document held in carrier's database.</p> <p><u>ELECTRONIC TICKET</u> - the itinerary/receipt issued by or on behalf of carrier, the electronic coupons and, if applicable, a boarding document.</p> <p><u>EUROPE</u> - the area comprised of Albania, Algeria, Andorra, Armenia, Austria, Azerbaijan, Azores, Belarus, Belgium, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Canary Islands, Croatia, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Georgia, Germany, Gibraltar, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Madeira, Malta, Monaco, Morocco, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Russian Federation (West of the Ural Mountains), San Marino, Serbia and Montenegro, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Tunisia, Turkey in Europe and Asia, Ukraine, and the United Kingdom.</p> <p><u>EUROPEAN COMMUNITY</u> ("EC") - The member states comprised of Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Luxembourg, The Netherlands, Norway, Portugal, Spain, Sweden and The United Kingdom.</p> <p><u>EXCESS BAGGAGE</u> - That part of baggage that is in excess of the baggage that may be carried free of charge.</p> <p><u>EXCESS BAGGAGE CHARGE</u> - The charge for the carriage of excess baggage.</p> <p><u>EXCHANGE ORDER</u> - A document issued by a carrier or its agents requesting issue of an appropriate passenger ticket and baggage check or provision of services to the person named in such document.</p> <p><u>EXCURSION FARES</u> - A non-advance purchase round trip fare, whereby reservations for all segments are not required at time of ticketing, unless specified otherwise in specific fare rules.</p> <p><u>FARE</u> - The amount charged by the carrier for the carriage of a passenger and his allowable free baggage and is the current fare that a carrier in the publication it normally uses to publish fares, holds out to the public, or the appropriate segment of the public as being applicable to the class of service to be furnished.</p> <p><u>FARE COMPONENT</u> - The portion of an itinerary between two consecutive fare construction points - the point of origin and the point of destination are fare construction points.</p> <p><u>FARE CONSTRUCTION POINTS</u> (fare break points) - The terminal points of a fare component (these are also termed fare break points).</p> <p><u>FARES TARIFF</u> - The tariff concerned with fares and related charges.</p> <p><u>FIRST CARRIER</u> - The participating carrier over whose air routes the first section of carriage is undertaken or performed.</p> <p><u>FLIGHT COUPON</u> Or in the case of an "electronic ticket", the electronic coupon - that portion of the ticket that bears the notation "good for passage" and indicates the particular places between which the coupon is good for carriage.</p> <p><u>FLIGHT NUMBER</u> - The numerical designation of a flight.</p> <p><u>FORCE MAJEURE</u> - Weather or other conditions beyond AH's control including, but not limited to acts of god, strikes, civil commotions, embargoes, wars, hostilities, terrorist activities or disturbances, whether actual, threatened or reported.</p> <p><u>FOREIGN AIR TRANSPORTATION</u> - Transportation between a point in the united states and a point outside thereof.</p> <p><u>FREEDOM RIGHTS</u></p> <p>(1) Third freedom - the right to deplane traffic in the foreign country that has been enplaned in the home country of the carrier.</p> <p>(2) Fourth freedom - the right to enplane traffic in the foreign country that is bound for the home country of the carrier.</p> <p>(3) Fifth freedom - the right to enplane traffic in one foreign country and deplane traffic in another foreign country, neither of which is carrier's country of registration.</p> <p>(4) Sixth freedom - the right to enplane traffic in one foreign country, transport the traffic via the country of registration and deplane the traffic in another foreign country.</p> <p>(5) Seventh freedom - the right to enplane traffic in one foreign country and transport the traffic without transiting the country of registration.</p> <p><u>FRENCH GOLD FRANCS</u> - The francs consisting of 65.50 milligrams of gold with a fineness of nine hundred thousandths.</p>
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C1	<p>[N]DEFINITIONS (Continued)</p> <p><u>FROM...TO...</u> - Application in one direction between two points.</p> <p><u>GATEWAY</u> - The passenger's first point of arrival or last point of departure within geographic locals, i.e.:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1) when traveling between areas 1, 2 or 3 the last point of departure/first point of arrival in that area. (2) when travelling between zones within an area, the last point of departure/first point of arrival in that zone. (3) when travelling between countries within a zone, the last point of departure in one country and the first point of arrival in another country. <p><u>GIVEAWAY</u> - Anything given gratuitously by a carrier whether or not paid for by the carrier, to passenger, other than air carriage from airport of departure to airport of destination.</p> <p><u>GLOBAL INDICATOR</u> - The global routing applicable to the fare, i.e., EH/AT/TS/PO/SF/AP</p> <p><u>GROUND TRANSPORTATION</u> - Bus, limousine, taxi or train service between the terminal and airport.</p> <p><u>GROUP ORGANIZER</u> - Any person, including a carrier or agent, who organizes and promotes prepaid and prearranged group travel.</p> <p><u>GUARDIAN</u> - The legal guardian or a person acting in lieu of parents in the event of death or legal incapacity of parents.</p> <p><u>HALF ROUND TRIP FARE</u> - Half of a specified or constructed round trip normal or special fare. in the absence of a specified or constructed round trip normal fare, the one way normal fare is considered to be a half round trip normal fare. if a specified or constructed one way special fare may be doubled to establish a round trip special fare, the one way special fare is considered to be a half round trip special fare.</p> <p><u>HOSPITALIZATION</u> - Admittance/confinement to a hospital on an inpatient basis of at least one night duration.</p> <p><u>IATA</u> - World Association of Airlines that operate international services.</p> <p><u>IATA RATE OF EXCHANGE (IROE)</u> - The rate of exchange issued by IATA from time to time and published in rule 145 (E) NTA(A) No. 373 or as provided under IATA Composite Passenger Resolution 024c that is used to convert local currency fares to a neutral unit of construction (NUC) and to convert NUC amounts to the currency of the country of commencement of transportation.</p> <p><u>IBERIA OR IBERIAN PENINSULA</u> - The area comprised of Gibraltar, Portugal (including Azores and Madeira) and Spain (including Balearic and Canary Islands).</p> <p><u>IMMEDIATE FAMILY</u>, Except as otherwise indicated - spouse, children, adopted children, sons-in-law, daughters-in-law, grandchildren, brothers, brothers-in-law, sisters, sisters-in-law, parents, parents-in-law and grandparents.</p> <p><u>IMPORTANT NOTICE</u> - If a fare is restricted and such restrictions are not clearly evident from the required ticket entries, such restrictions may be written, stamped or pre-printed in plain language in the "endorsement/restrictions" box of the applicable flight coupon(s) and/or attached to the ticket by use of an appropriate notice. in addition, where a fare is restricted to time of travel or period of validity, a special fare notice similar to that shown below may be used.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>IMPORTANT NOTICE</u></p> <p>This is a "special fare" ticket that involves travel restrictions. When making or changing reservations, please advise the airline or your agent of the special fare so that they may assist you in complying with the restrictions. Failure to comply with the restrictions may result in an increase in fare and/or additional cost to you. In some cases there are fees for changing or canceling special fare tickets.</p> <p><u>NOTES:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1) This will not preclude a carrier from producing its restricted fares notices if so desired.
