“I” signifies that the Proof of Vaccination Credential (PVC) was uploaded successfully.

“V” signifies that PVC information has been entered, and the criteria has been met, however an issue has occurred with respect to the image upload.

The traveller has reported symptoms (S) or has an unsuitable quarantine plan (Q).

Note: Air operators should remind travellers to always have their paper proof of vaccination available for verification at the border

ArriveCAN Receipt

This ArriveCAN receipt is confirmation that you have successfully submitted your information in ArriveCAN. You can also see your receipt in the ArriveCAN mobile app or by signing in online.

- If you're entering Canada by air, show this receipt prior to boarding your flight.
- You must present your receipt to the Canada Border Services Officer upon arrival in Canada.

If you started over or made another submission, use the most recent receipt. Your latest submission will replace any earlier submissions you made.

Bring a paper or electronic copy of your proof of COVID-19 tests and vaccination when you travel and retain them throughout your quarantine period (if applicable). You may be asked to present them at the border by a Canada Border Services Officer where their status will be confirmed.

The proof of vaccination must be in English, French, or a certified translation. If the proof of vaccination is not in English or French, bring both the official document and the translation when you travel.
